



Dear Friends,

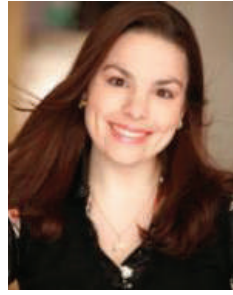

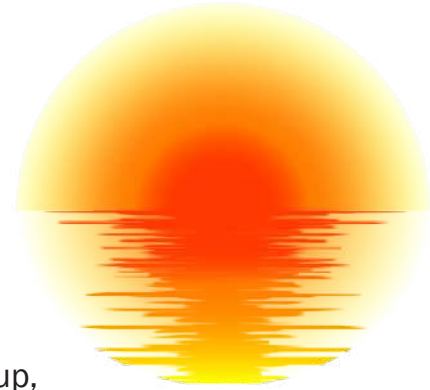

## A Message from Rabbi Scott Roland

Dear Friends,

A few weeks ago, a task force was convened to discuss attendance at our Friday night services. We are blessed to be in a community where many of our members have a regular practice of hosting and attending Shabbat dinners. However, this means that attendance on Friday nights is often lacking. We currently have programs like Chaverim Shabbat and Pajama Neshama that bring larger crowds on the occasional Friday night. As a group, we discussed several ideas that might allow for more vibrant Shabbat evening services. The group comprised members of the Worship Committee, the Board, as well as other interested parties.



One of the programs we discussed was our successful summer Sundown Shabbat services. In the past, these services were unique to the summer months when the weather is conducive to eating outside. Not only is it lovely to pray in the fresh air, but our outdoor services also allowed us to avoid the issue of bringing potentially non-Kosher food into our synagogue. Our custom for Sundown Shabbat is to invite our members to bring a dairy or pareve picnic dinner to enjoy after services. As a task force, we extensively discussed and decided upon a policy change that will allow for bringing dairy/pareve meals into the synagogue for indoor Sundown Shabbatot without compromising the kosher status of our Shaarey Tikvah kitchen.

We need not worry that the kashrut of our kitchen and utensils will be compromised by the mere proximity of potentially non-kosher food. As we experiment with bringing Sundown Shabbat indoors for the winter, our kosher kitchen will be locked and tabletops will be covered in order to maintain the kashrut of our kitchen and eating surfaces. Those who are able will be encouraged to bring picnic blankets to eat upon in order to maintain the informal and festive nature of our outdoor Sundown Shabbatot. Individuals are encouraged to ask before sharing food to ensure that the food was prepared in a manner consistent with their kashrut practice. For those interested, we are exploring the option of working with a kosher caterer to provide boxed dinners for those who wish to order and pay in advance. The shul will provide wine, grape juice, and challah as per usual. Most importantly, we will have a joyful, meaningful, and songful Kabbalat Shabbat and Maariv to set the mood for our Shabbat meal.

It is my sincere hope that this compromise will combine the best opportunities for community building while protecting our kitchen's kashrut for future communal meals. It will also provide an additional opportunity for a vibrant Shabbat gathering open to all who wish to participate. ## **A Message from Rabbi Rachel Brown, Director of Congregational Learning**

### **There is a lot going on!**

It may be cold outside but CST is heating up with education-related activity. Perhaps the biggest news is our Annual Congregational Shabbaton: From Friday, January 17 to Sunday, January 19, we will explore the theme of “Love Your Neighbor as Yourself.” The centerpiece of our weekend will be an encounter with members of the Chagrin Valley Islamic Center (CVIC). Guided by visiting scholars Rabbi Nancy Fuchs Kreimer, Ph.D. and Dr. Zeki Saritoprak, we will spend time exploring the places in which our cultures overlap as well as where they diverge.

When you join us, you will have opportunities to learn with Rabbi Fuchs Kreimer and Dr. Saritoprak and to learn with CVIC adults in sessions facilitated by our scholars. CST and CVIC children will have the chance to learn and create together, facilitated by professionals in the area of interfaith relationships. We will also welcome our Muslim brothers and sisters to join us for Havdallah, and they will invite us to join them for one of their worship services. In between, there will be ample opportunities for members of our two congregations to hang out with each other during meals and social activities.

This Shabbaton program is one of the most ambitious and exciting I’ve had the privilege to plan! I hope you will join us, learn with us, and play with us.

While our Shabbaton is open to congregants of all ages, there is more exciting news, just for teens: B’nai Emunah and B’nai Torah are back! Beginning with a teen lunch and learn in November, students in grades 8-12 are meeting each month with a different guest facilitating a discussion on a different topic of relevance to our teens. On Shabbat, May 30, which also coincides with Shavuot, we will celebrate the Jewish educational milestones of continuing education for our 10th grade B’nai Emunah participants and the graduation of our 12th grade participants during services and with a celebratory lunch.

In other youth programming, USY/Kadima is also back! Thanks to the interest of a few involved teens, we are planning USY activities for students in 9th -12th grades and Kadima activities for students in 5th-8th grade. In the near future there will be a range of offerings for our students, including events for our CST chapter, programs shared with other chapters in the greater Cleveland area, and regional opportunities.

Of course, these new programs are in addition to our already existing educational programs. These include Shabbat Clubhouse and The Open Dor Academy (TODA) for our children on Shabbat mornings, and, for adults, weekly Mishnah study with Rabbi Roland as well as adult Lunch and Learns coming up February 1 and April 4.

If you have ideas or fantasies about other educational programming that you’d like to experience at CST, please be in touch with me. And in the meantime, join me in the excitement about everything that is going on!
