***B'ruchim Habaim* – Welcome! The rabbi, cantor, executive director, trustees and staff cordially welcome our members and our many guests. May each be blessed with a year of health, peace, and happiness.**

Please consider the following guidelines for High Holiday Services at Shaarey Tikvah.
Direct any and all questions to our ushers or board members.**

Please DO:

- Join us in our sanctuary and open yourself up to the experience of ritual life at Shaarey Tikvah.
- Wear a head covering (kippah). All guests are encouraged to wear head coverings.
- Wear a prayer shawl (tallit). Jews over the age of Bar/Bat Mitzvah are encouraged to wear a tallit. Extra tallitot are available in the social hall.
- Sing along! Nai Nai's are acceptable if you don't know the words. Clap hands and have fun!
- Bring your children. Allow young children to sit and play with appropriate toys and read books. (Magnetic Shul, a fun Shabbat and Holiday activity, is available in the back of the sanctuary.) Electronic devices are not appropriate for use in the synagogue on Shabbat and Holidays.
- Happy baby and toddler noises only enrich our communal prayer!
- It is okay to feed young children snacks during services. (Though on Yom Kippur it would be appropriate to do so outside of the sanctuary.)
- Ask those around you for help finding your place, following along, or any other questions that may arise during services. Ushers may also be helpful in this regard. You may also approach the rabbi after services.
- Turn off or your phone prior to entering the synagogue.

Please DO NOT:

- Use cameras, phones, or other electronic devices in the building.
- Allow children to be disruptive.

USHERS MAY:

- Welcome you at the door.
- Ask to see your ticket/nametag.
- Give you a Shaarey Tikvah lanyard in which to insert your ticket/nametag.
- Guide you toward the head coverings (kippot), prayer shawls (tallitot), and prayer books (machzorim).
- Politely ask you to put away electronic devices, or politely ask your children to refrain from running or being too noisy in the halls outside of the sanctuary.
- Ask you to refrain from leaving/entering the sanctuary when the Ark is open, during the silent Amidah and the Kedusha, while the Torah and Haftarah are being read (It is okay to leave/enter between aliyot), and during the rabbi's sermon.

- The Congregation's **High Holy Days Shofar Campaign** is under way. Please consider your pledge now and help keep the synagogue's finances strong and secure. Please turn in your pledge card during the appeal on Yom Kippur.
- **Shofar Squad** – Those adults and children owning "shofarot" are invited to bring them to the Neilah service towards the conclusion of Yom Kippur Day. The "shofarot" will be sounded from the side aisles of the sanctuary upon the Rabbi's signal immediately following the "Tekiah G'dolah!"
- Please check out our **electronic message board** located in the Atrium. There are many items of interest.
- The **Corners of Our Field** campaign is in partnership with Mazon. Food bags are available at the synagogue. Return bags to the shul any time before October 15th. We will try to pick-up donations for those who cannot get to the shul. Mazon donation envelopes are also available.
- Our **Inspiration Library**, offering uplifting books for adults and children, is located in the back of the sanctuary. Please return the books to the shelves at the end of each day.
- We have a **hearing assistance system** available. A headphone and transmitter are available for you to use. Please see one of the ushers for assistance.
