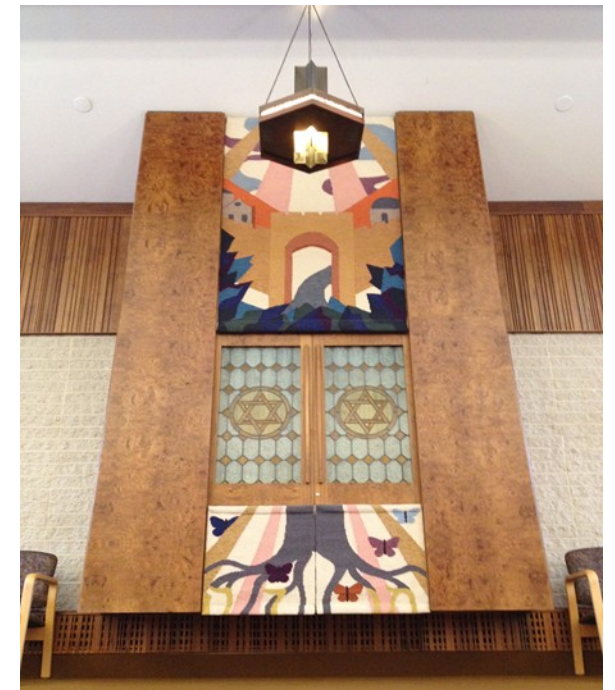
#### **YouthAbility – Help These Community Heroes Help Others.**
