COMMUNITY EVENTS

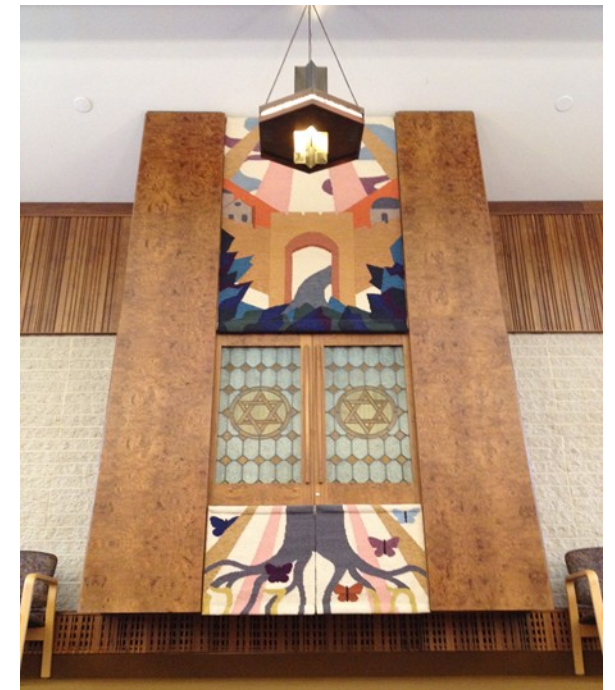
